On Friday (5th August) we are having our **Jeans for Genes** charity fundraiser day, where students can wear jeans to school if they bring a **gold coin donation**.



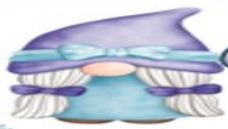
